Prepare the way, O Zion, your Christ is drawing near!
Let every hill and valley a level way appear.

Advent is a strange season. It's especially strange during liturgical year B, which begins on December 3 this year. The Gospel for the year is Mark, which starts not with Jesus' birth, but rather his baptism and goes immediately into his ministry. (That's a bit of an inside joke; everything in Mark happens immediately!) So what happens with no nativity, no shepherds or angels, to say nothing about wise men?

Well, we can remember that Advent is a time of holy waiting. During the days when the New Testament was composed, believers thought the Parousia, the Messiah's return, was around the corner. Tomorrow. Before they died, for absolutely sure. Except it didn't happen that way.

So the scriptures we use during this season are a bit dark and apocryphal, exhorting us to prepare ourselves for the Christ's return. Make sure all our spiritual affairs are in order, just as we would prepare our material goods for our (eventual) death. Advent has something, but not everything, to do with preparing for the birth of our Savior.

Believe me, I know lots of people want to come to church come December and sing Christmas carols every week. I understand. But if we take away the time of waiting, it's a bit like a pregnancy. As much as a mother-to-be would like the discomfort to end, it's much better for both baby and mom if it goes full-term.

So enjoy your Advent. I love the devotional this year, which is for families small and large. If you're the type who loves InstaGram or Facebook, ask me about AdventWord 2017. And Marla Maertin found an amazing project called a Reverse Advent Calendar: Find two wine boxes. Every day of December, put an item in a slot—food, shampoo, diaper wipes, you get the idea—and then donate the whole thing to a food pantry. Bring it here and I'll deliver it. Or call me and I'll pick it up. It would be good for me to visit more of you at your homes! What a fantastic idea for families with young ones about, to see generosity in action.

Also, let us remember that the pre-Christmas season is incredibly stressful for many, especially those who have recently lost a loved one, or those who are trying to maintain a balanced diet or weight, or those who struggle with addictions. Some people just find this time of year depressing, when it's dark so much of the day.

Play your Christmas carols to your heart's content at home; come carol with the kids at DeGraff on December 3; sing along in the stores; and enjoy them during the pageant on December 17! But let's contemplate the loveliness that Advent brings. Please. Meanwhile, see you in church.

If you would like a quietly devout, contemplative Yule Tide season, you will have to go to a cave, up on a mountain or out to sea. Retailers plan 2 and 3 years ahead of time how to squeeze every dime out of you for that one day of the year. We haven't a chance to avoid the blatant commercial bombardment.

My oldest daughter rebelled against this onslaught by limiting her holiday purchases to 3 presents and a stocking for each of her children. "If it was good enough for Jesus, it is good enough for my kids."

Christmas isn't about presents; it is about being present for the remembrance of a baby's birth, so that after death we may have eternal life.

In Sunday School we sing, "Christmas is Jesus' Birthday." Every Christian home I have ever been in at Christmas has a crèche or manger scene on display. How many kids have gotten in trouble for taking baby Jesus away from his straw filled crib? I did. As a child, I thought that wasn't a very nice place for a baby. He was much better off in my doll buggy. Kids can be so literal.

Special decorations, special clothes, once a year special food, all helps us remember how special the remembrance of this birth really is. "For unto us a child is born...." *Isaiah 9:6-7*
