Let the kindness of our Lord God be over us.

Make the work of our hands last! Psalm 90:17, Common English Bible

Forbearance and kindness. Excellent words for Lent, I believe. Lent is a season of fasting—either actual physical refraining from particular foods (coffee or chocolate), or from particular acts, as we enter into a time of introspection. God help me, every year, I choose a fast from resentment. God willing, every year it's better, but still that nasty sin creeps into my life. It did just today, now that I think about it. Stupid.

But forbearance, our Fruit of the Spirit for March, means patient self-control or restraint. Maybe Lent is not only a time to fast from our sins, but a time of being a little less hard on ourselves—so that we have more joy and love to offer the world? But forbearance also carries a tone of tolerance toward others. I've thought a lot about why people lash out at others, and often the reason is that they're experiencing pain. If we can forbear from resentment or indignation, maybe we can ask a couple gentle questions that might help someone excavate their pain, and start on the road to healing. Will it work every time? Of course not. But what if it does, just once?

Which of course leads right into kindness, the Fruit for April. The word in Hebrew, chesed ,(,,,),)carries deep meaning—lovingkindness, steadfastness, mercy, grace, loyal love—they are all wrapped up into those three Hebrew letters that exhibit the fullest nature of God's love for the world. Kindness is allowing another driver to turn, but kindness is more like refraining from all evil—exemplifying Jesus Christ in every aspect of our lives. As I think about Lent's command to examine our lives—inner and outer—that thought makes me flinch a bit. Kindness is not always my first reaction; sometimes it takes a real effort. The more we practice, the easier it comes. If we look at the verse from Psalm 90: when we allow God's kindness to guide us, our impact of kindness grows deeper. Thanks be to God!

The Book of Psalms is a wonderful repository of the depths of human emotion: from joyous exuberant praise to loathing and outright hatred (sometimes in the period of a few verses). During Lent, on Wednesday evenings we'll delve into some of the psalms, and learn to use them more effectively in our prayer lives as well as our daily lives. We gather at 6 for some delicious soup and a little dessert, then we spend about an hour in our talk and study. I hope you'll join us, starting on March 13 until April 10. It's a drop-in class, so come when you can.

So March with forbearance, and when April arrives, exhibit as much Christly kindness as ever you can. Don't flinch, but examine your inner self boldly and with grace toward yourself. Meanwhile, I'll see you in church.




# Deacon's Notes

A group of young people have begun their exploration into what it means to be a faithful baptized member of the particular body of Christ: First Pres Tonawanda. The curriculum is focused on preparing youth to authentically answer the traditional membership questions:

- Will you be Christ's faithful disciple obeying his word and showing his love?
