Leslie's Musings

"A sound roars from the sky without warning, the roar of a violent wind, and the whole house where you are gathered reverberates with the sound. Then a flame appears, dividing into smaller flames and spreading from one person to the next. All the people present are filled with the Holy Spirit..." Acts 2.2-4a, The Voice Bible

The Spirit is afoot! It's so difficult to contemplate what the believers felt and thought on that first Pentecost. As they gathered, a visual confirmation of all they had seen and heard seemed to dance on each one's head as a flame. We might say the believers found their passion and began to exhibit visible manifestations of a changed life—or as St. Augustine and our confessional heritage put it, outward signs of inward grace.

We've talked about "mountaintop" experiences. My son just returned from a great festival where he saw a bunch of his favorite bands, all framed by the Gulf of Mexico. "I wanna go back," he sighed, as I drove him home from the airport.

Of course we want to stay on the mountaintop. It's fun and exhilarating! It's so darned easy to be faithful among all those converts surrounding you—people who have undergone the same transformation and are filled with the Holy Spirit—look, it's even dancing on our heads!

It's another thing altogether to go through the daily slog. To consider the humanity of the less-than-transformed who surround us. Those who don't seem to want to work. The homeless. The addicted. Geez, just pull it together, will you?

I'm so thankful that the beloveds of this church have taken steps to combat the scourge of opioid addiction in our community. Lots of us have opened our eyes and ears and hearts to try and understand the facts surrounding and leading up to this chaotic reality. It seems impossible, yet we need to remember:

The vast majority of opioid addictions begin with legal, prescribed use. Student athletes receive an opioid after an injury, or your young adult after wisdom teeth extraction.

The vast majority of those addicted are white males, living in the suburbs, around 40 years old.

Because prescriptions are now much harder to obtain, people with addiction are turning to cheaper, more available heroin even faster.

So why is this our problem? Well obviously, because Jesus commands us to look after the hopeless and the hurting. But also because it's affecting us directly. You may not know about the addictions in your neighbors, but they are out there. You don't know about children, uncles, mothers and friends suffering. But knowledge is power, and we're going to continue to educate ourselves and others. Is it hard? Absolutely. Is it soul draining? Sometimes. But thank God we're answering the call that has been placed on us, and for that I am sooo grateful.

Stay educated, stay compassionate, stay full of the Spirit. And meanwhile, I'll see you in church!

Chasing the Dragon ~ Screening on June 7th

What do a high school athlete and a middle-aged truck driver have in common? They are the face of the opioid addiction epidemic. They're the people, along with the perceived "ghetto addicts," that are dying from heroin and opiate overdoses. According to law enforcement statistics, most addictions start from LEGAL prescriptions—from sports injuries to repetitive muscle pain. The most common overdoses today? 30-40 year-old white men from the suburbs.

On Wednesday, June 7, at 7:00 pm, we're hosting a screening of *Chasing the Dragon*, a film produced by the FBI that confronts the horrors of the heroin and opioid plague that is hitting us hard not only in Buffalo, but in the Tonawandas as well.

The film is graphic, because it depicts the hard edge of drug use and addiction. Viewer discretion is advised. Please feel free to invite friends and neighbors. We'll have a short debriefing session afterwards; FBI agent Brian Burns is scheduled to attend and can answer questions.
